

# Letter from the Executive Director

#### Dear Nature NL supporters,

First of all: Thank you for your continued support. 2023 was a very exciting year for Nature NL full of inspiring public talks, walks, workshops, and new programming.

We implemented two new pilot projects in 2023: our Insect Monitoring Project in collaboration with Memorial University's Biology Department, the <u>Botanical Garden</u>, and <u>The Rooms</u>, supported by Memorial University's <u>Office of Public Engagement</u>'s Quick Start Fund. This project is part of a North American wide research effort to <u>monitor insects</u> in urban environment. The pilot project was very successful: Thanks to Nature NL members, volunteers, and staff we were able to collect and sort specimens that are now part of The Rooms' Entomology Collection. We also hosted several insect related outreach events that were very well attended. Thank you to everyone who came out in support of the project. You can read more about the project <u>here</u>.

Last year, we also implemented our NatureHood Pilot Project NatureHood: Nature for New Canadians. Supported by Nature Canada, Environment and Climate Change Canada, and TD Friends of the Environment, our NatureHood project is part of a <u>pan-Canadian initiative</u> to connect under-served youth and community members with Newfoundland and Labrador's nature. For the pilot project, we partnered with the <u>Association of New Canadians</u>, We delivered workshops and guided walks for kids and youth and we also organized a field trip to <u>Terra Nova Migratory Bird Sanctuary</u>. We welcomed several new volunteers and hired several new staff in 2023, including an Insect Monitoring Coordinator, a NatureHood Coordinator, a Program Coordinator, and a Volunteer and Events Coordinator.

Our AGM and Photo Night took place on March 21st, 2024. During the AGM, the Executive Director provided a report of activities in 2023, followed by the Treasurer Report, and an update from Nature NL's President. As part of the President Report, a motion was presented and passed for a special meeting (tentatively scheduled for June 2024) to adopt Nature NL's new by-laws. The reasons for this special meeting are:

- · Currently working on updating our by-laws.
- Work will extend past the date of the AGM.
- Proposing to present updated by-laws at a special meeting closer to the summer.

We also welcomed three new board members, including a new treasurer and a new secretary. We said goodbye to four board members including the previous treasurer and IT board member. I would like to thank all our Board members for their tireless efforts in ensuring that Nature NL can continue to deliver high quality events and promote the conservation and appreciation of our beautiful province. During our Photo Night, friends of Nature NL shared photos of from Wabush to St. Vincent's and everywhere in between featuring mammals, birds, slime molds, and stunning landscape photos. We cannot wait for our Photo Night next year.






### Other Updates






#### Social Media Growth




